- (1) Based on the feature of Anterior and Coronal differentiate the following sounds: [p], [k], [c], and [t].
- (2) How synchronic and diachronic dimensions are relevant in the study of a natural language?
- (3) What are the major levels of a natural language? Explain.
- (4) Differentiate between [ph] and [f], and [bh] and [v] with regard to place and manner of articulation and phonation process.
- (5) How can you justify that 'strip' is a valid word, 'strib' is a potential word, while 'ftrib' is an invalid word in English?
- (6) Decompose the following word showing its hierarchical pattern of formation: *denationalizationality*.
- (7) How do we derive 'truly' from 'true'? Show which morphological rule is activated here.
- (8) What is the morphological identity of 'o' in 'will-o-the-wisp', and 'Indo-European'?
- (9) Who can you define the morphological identity and function of '-er' in words like 'taller', 'finer', 'smaller', 'player', 'worker', and 'singer'?
- (10) Show how transformational rules are ordered with the example: *Wash yourself*.

- (11) How can you explain that '*He killed himself*' and '*He himself killed*' are two different types of transformation with two different types of pronoun?
- (12) Based on the theory of sub-categorization show the thematic structure of the following three verbs: *smile*, *call*, and *give*.
- (13) Show to which type of homonym the following words belong: *write*, *right*, and *rite*.
- (14) Dissolve the ambiguity embedded in the following sentence: *Time flies like an arrow*.
- (15) Explain:  $NP_{\text{sing}} \rightarrow \text{Det} + N + \emptyset$  while  $NP_{\text{plur}} \rightarrow \text{Det} + N + s$
- (16) Following Charles Ferguson identify nine rubrics of Diglossia.
- (17) Distinguish between 'acrolect', 'mesolect', and 'basilect'.
