

Practical Exposure

IIFM believes in the importance of giving its students extensive practical exposure alongside invaluable academic inputs to ensure their holistic development. This ensures a perfect mix of business acumen and academic intellect. Such exposure is provided by means of Summer Internship, field visits, industry visits, guest lectures, open learning days and live projects. A ten week compulsory Summer Internship provides an opportunity for students to apply academic knowledge to real time management problems. A 28 days long field trip in the first year is conducted during the programme to provide hands on ground experience. Guest lectures provide students with a chance to interact with representatives of the corporate world and learn about the latest management practices.

The Summer Internship and Placements 2021 like always, have received tremendous support from the Industry. 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POST GRADUATE DIPLOMA IN FORESTRY MANAGEMENT

The two-year Post Graduate Diploma in Forestry Management (PGDFM) was launched in July, 1988 for young graduates from all over the country, belonging to different streams of knowledge to meet the requirement for professional managerial manpower in forestry and allied sectors. PGDFM is recognized by the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) and equated to a corresponding Master's Degree of an Indian University by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU). This programme is accredited by National Board of Accreditation (NBA).

The PGDFM programme aims to develop professionals who will have a judicious mix of three different kinds of skills-first, familiarity with a variety of scientific and technical aspects of forestry, environment and development sector. Second, grounding in basic analytical and managerial skills; and third, to apply the technical, analytical and managerial skills in the real field to assist and influence the decision making process.

PROGRAMME STRUCTURE & PEDAGOGY

A judicious mix of different modules like class-room teaching, structured field work and project-work in client organizations are used to inculcate managerial skills. In class-room teaching, advanced pedagogical techniques, i.e., case method, role play and simulation games are extensively used


Class Room

PGDFM course is designed in a manner that the overall learning goals in the programme are achieved and synergy is created between course-work, fieldwork and Summer Internship.

Each one credit unit course has 30 sessions of 60 minutes each. The total class room time per one credit unit course equals 30 hours, besides approximately 70 hours of supportive and preparatory work.







Summer Internship (SI) & Project Work

Summer Internship is an integral part of the PGDFM programme and opportunity to the students to be exposed to real life situations and to the immersed in diverse work environments. Students are attached to various corporate houses, government agencies and National and International development agencies to work on independent projects.

A large number of organizations have been participating in Summer Internship every year. This year IIFM hosted a good mix of organizations from multiple sectors offering some very intriguing internship assignments; Government departments, Development Sector organizations, Forest and Environment related organizations were the major recruiters. Participating organizations included WWF, The Nature Conservancy, Sambodhi Research, Wildlife Trust of india, ICICI Foundation, Phia, Annapurna Finance, Jai Kisan, Pradan to name a few.

Field Work

The PGDFM course comprises two field work components with the following objectives:

- To provide first hand exposure to the functioning of an organization.
- To relate class room learning concepts and skills with real life management situations.
- To learn through on the job experience.

The first field work component is scheduled after Term II in the first year which is of three-week duration. It sensitizes the students to the intricacies of micro-finance, marketing, livelihood, natural resource management, functioning of forest based industries and the developmental issues of the tribal and rural poor in the Indian milieu.

The second fieldwork component is schedule after Term V in the second year, which is of two weeks duration in the area of specialization chosen the student.



Evaluation and Grading

The PGDFM programme is built on active participation from every student in each component, namely, class-room, field work and Summer Internship. The evaluation process is continuous and aims at optimizing the students' involvement in learning from various courses as well as from opportunities outside the class-room. Accordingly, students get grades on the basis of assignments, quizzes, evaluation of projects and term examinations.

ADMISSION (For Indian Students)

Admission to the fully residential two year PGDFM is open to graduates from any discipline provided he/she fulfils the eligibility criteria and qualifies through the selection process.

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Selection Process

Each batch is selected through an extremely stringent selection process, consisting of several filters to get the best minds in the country. The present batch (2021-23) has been selected from a pool of top scorers in CAT/XAT who further appeared for rigorous screening rounds of Written Aptitude Test and Personal Interviews.

Eligibility

A candidate must hold a bachelor's degree in any discipline with at least 50% marks or equivalent CGPA (45% in case of candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste (SC), Scheduled Tribe (ST) and Differently Abled (DA) (it may also be referred to as Persons With Disability (PWD) categories), awarded by any of the universities incorporated by an act of the central or state legislature in India or other educational institutions established by an act of Parliament or declared to be deemed as a university under Section 3 of the UGC Act. 1956, or possess an equivalent qualification recognized by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India.

Candidates appearing for the final year of bachelor's degree/equivalent qualification examination and those who have completed degree requirements and are awaiting results can also apply. If selected, such candidates will be allowed to join the programme provisionally, only if he/she submits a certificate latest by June 30, 2022 from the Principal/Registrar of his/her College/Institute (issued on or before June 30, 2022) stating that the candidate has completed all the requirements for obtaining the bachelor's degree/ equivalent qualification on the date of the issue of the certificate.

CAT 2021 / XAT 2022

Apply and appear for CAT 2021 / XAT 2022. IIFM will use CAT/ XAT score for short-listing the candidates. IIMs/XLRI have no role either in the selection process or in the conduct of the programme.

Admission through CAT 2021 and XAT 2022 followed by Personal Interviews which will be conducted Online.



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FEES STRUCTURE (For Indian Students)

The fee payable by students admitted to PGDFM is as follows:

General Category/ Non-creamy OBC/ Differently Abled Candidates/ EWS: - They are required to pay Rs. 4,68,000 (non-refundable) as the first year fee receipt of the admission offer. The second year of academic fee of Rs. 3,12,000/- (non-refundable) has to be paid on or before the commencement of the second year's academic session, i.e. before the Fourth Term.

SC/ST/DA Candidates in SC/ST Category: - They are required to pay an amount of Rs. 2,80,800/- (non-refundable) as the first year fee on the receipt of the admission offer. The second year of academic fee of Rs. 1,87,200/- (non-refundable) has to be paid in second year academic session i.e. before the Fourth Term.

FOR FOREIGN NATIONALS / OVERSEAS CITIZEN OF INDIA / PERSONS OF INDIAN ORIGIN/CHILDREN OF INDIAN WORKERS IN THE GULF COUNTRIES

Overseas candidates including Foreign Nationals/ Overseas Citizen of India/Persons of Indian Origin/ Children of Indian Workers in the Gulf Countries who seek admission to IIFM, Bhopal in Post Graduate Diploma in Forestry Management (PGDFM) can apply in the prescribed application from furnishing their latest GMAT scores. GMAT Scores (Not earlier than 24 months from the last date of submission of Application) CAT 2021 / XAT 2022 scores).

Admission to the fully residential two year PGDFM is open to graduates (a minimum of 15 years of education under the 10+2+3 pattern (i.e., 12 years of schooling + 3 year Bachelor's degree) from any discipline provided he/she fulfils the eligibility criteria and qualifies through the selection process. A candidate must hold a bachelor's degree in any discipline with at least 50% marks or equivalent CGPA, awarded by any of the universities incorporated by an Act of the central or state legislature in India or other educational institutions established by an Act of Parliament or declared to be Deemed as a University Under Section 3 of the UGC Act 1956, or possess an equivalent qualification recognized by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India.

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Other Important Information

- Providing inaccurate or incomplete information or malpractice of any kind or canvassing will result in disqualification of the candidate.
- The mandatory disclosure as per AICTE guidelines relating to admission procedure is hosted on our website (www.iifm.ac.in/ admission).

Eligibility & Selection :

- 1. Candidate must hold a bachelor's degree (with a minimum of 15 years of education) in any discipline with at least 50% marks or equivalent CGPA awarded by any recognized University as per the country of origin. Candidates appearing for the final year of bachelor's degree examination and those who have completed degree requirements and are awaiting results can also apply. If selected, such candidates will be allowed to join the programme provisionally, only if he/she submits a certificate latest by June 30, 2022 from the Principal/Registrar of his/her College/Institute (issued on or before June 30, 2022) stating that the candidate has completed all the requirements for obtaining the bachelor's degree/equivalent qualification on the date of the issue of the certificate. Selected candidates having qualifications acquired from foreign universities/ Boards are required to obtain equivalence from AIU, India (httpl.www.aiu.ac.in).
- 3. The criteria for admission shall be CAT 2021/ XAT 2022 scores for PGDFM 2022 24 Admission followed by Personal Interview which will be conducted through online.


Definitions:

- **1. Foreign students** holding passports issued by foreign countries including people of Indian origin who have acquired the nationality of foreign countries.
- 3. Students passing the qualifying examinations from Boards or Universities located in foreign countries as external students and dependents of NRI studying in India will not merit the status of international students.

Under this category only the students who have studied and passed the qualifying examination from a school located in foreign country shall be considered. This will include the student studying in school and / or college situated in foreign country, even if the concerned school / college is affiliated to any Board of secondary education or a University in India. However, wards of NRI / PIO / FN, who is studying for the qualifying examination in school / college located in India are excluded.

3. Equivalence Certificate:

Fee Structure for International Students

For issue of Equivalence Certificate, US \$ 200 or equivalent Indian currency shall be paid to "Association of Indian Universities, New Delhi", India. Admission Procedure

STEP- 1: Visit IIFM website : www.iifm.ac.in/admission - submit the application online along with the scanned copies of documents and remit the Registration fee online through net banking / credit card.

STEP-2: Personal Interview

Personal interview over online/offline mode to test aptitude towards the programme and command over English language.

STEP-3: Final Selection and Visa

The Institute will issue admission offer letter to the selected candidates. The selected candidates on the basis of offer letter get study visa for joining the course. The regular classes will be held from 1st week of July, 2022. The selected students has to complete all the formalities including remittance of course fee before that.

Payment of course Fee:


The course fee including hostel rent for two years for foreign students is US \$ 21,000, for SAARC students the course fee is US \$ 14,000. The fee does not include mess charges, travel expenses for joining the course, visa charges etc. The fee should be paid in two instalments i.e. 60% of the fee payable in first year and 40% in second year.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Campus

The Institute has a sprawling campus spread over 230 acres located on a lush green hill-top surrounded by water-bodies on three sides. The building-complex includes the Academic-Complex, Library, Computer Center, Hostel, Fully Air Conditioned Student Mess, Administration and Accounts wings. The Academic Complex of IIFM includes Fully air-conditioned hi-tech class-rooms, seminar rooms equipped with video conferencing facilities and a Faculty Block. - Software Support Services Windows Operating System, Office Automation software (Open Source & MS-2. Office 2016), Open Source GIS, Statistical analysis tool SPSS & R, Tally 9.0 ERP, End-Point Anti-Virus, etc.
- 3. The language lab facility provides the opportunity to learn new languages by enrolling in the open-source and available software platforms.
- 4. Web-based & IP to IP based Video Conferencing facility using dedicated systems.
- 5. Google G-suite Services A suite of best-in-class productivity tools built for teaching and learning.

The computer center has a well-established computer lab with 60 computers for student's access. Internet facility is provided through a 100 Mbps dedicated leased line from NKN and 100 Mbps from BSNL configured in High availability mode and are serving the need of the IIFM community.





Library and Information Services

The IIFM library is an ocean of knowledge and information with a vast collection of books and journals on subjects of environment, development, forestry and beyond. This multi-storied air-conditioned building offers a vast pool of literature to students. Subscription to a number of international e-journals is a key ingredient of the IIFM library. Institutional membership with DELNET as well as continuous updating of resource base and inclusion of publication of current interest is constantly undertaken. A collection of films on forestry, environment, development, livelihood and management are available. The Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) facility is available on all terminals connected through LAN. The library has more than 42881 books and subscription to more than 183 National and International periodicals, a number of CDs and DVD's on various topics of academic interests, and subscription to a number of International online databases such as J-gate (Management sciences), EBSCO (Business Source Elite and Environment Complete). EBSCO e-Book Business Collection, Science Direct(Business Management and Accounting, Environmental Science), Indiastat, Prowess and Emrald Marketing : e-journal Collection.





Hostel, Guest House & Mess

Three hostel blocks having one hundred and ten fully furnished rooms are available for accommodating boys and girls separately. The hostel rooms are connected with internet facility through LAN and Wi-Fi. The fully air-conditioned student mess is equipped with automated and semi-automated equipment and cooking systems. It is capable of serving about 300 people at a time with nutritious and wholesome food.

Sports Facilities

A wide range of sports facilities are available on campus including Badminton, Lawn Tennis, Table Tennis, Football, Cricket, Basketball, Volleyball, Carrom Board, Chess and Gym. Intra-Institute sports tournaments are organized regularly and the Institute participates every year in the All India Forest Sports and Games Meet organized by MoEF & CC, Gol. Here at IIFM, every goal scored is applauded and every point won calls for a celebration.





Public Relations cell

The Public Relations Cell is the mouthpiece of IIFM, Bhopal. It is responsible for all external communications. The cell manages all official social media handles of the Indian Institute of Forest Management, Bhopal - Facebook, Twitter, YouTube, Instagram etc.
