CAT 2024 Syllabus

The main sections for CAT Syllabus 2024 include Verbal Ability & Reading Comprehension (VARC), Data Interpretation & Logical Reasoning (DILR) and Quantitative Aptitude (QA). There are a total of 66 questions which will be asked from each section (~20 questions each). Experts suggest referring to books by Arun Sharma and Nishit K Sinha. Moreover, free online videos by top coaching institutes can give you a competitive edge.

Get Familiar With CAT Exam Pattern and Marking Scheme

Every year, over 2 lakh candidates apply for the CAT exam fighting for a total of 5500 seats in the 21 IIMs. CAT Syllabus consists of three main components viz. Verbal Ability and Reading Comprehension (VARC), Data Interpretation and Logical Reasoning (DILR), and Quantitative Ability (QA). Total number of questions for each question is provided in the table below.

Clearing CAT is not easy, the 66 questions asked in the exam are challenging. The exam is difficult, and the competition level is very high with only 0.02% of students getting into IIMs. It requires a well-planned and meticulously designed preparation strategy of at least 3-4 months to achieve the 90+ percentile range. Note that the cut-offs for IIMs are usually in the range of 95-99+ percentile.



Things To Consider Before Preparing For CAT

- Thoroughly Understand the Syllabus: Understanding the CAT Syllabus is the key
 to understanding your strengths and weaknesses. Riddhi Dugar, CAT Topper
 who scored 99.91 percentile in CAT 2023 says- "I finished my syllabus a few
 months before the exam itself, this allowed to focus more on mocks and
 understand my strengths and weaknesses"
- Analyze Past Papers and Trends and Gather Quality Study Materials: if you have the right study material, you can devise the right study plan. This includes previous year question papers and test series. Anirudh Das who scored 99.81 in CAT 2023 emphasises on tracking your scores in test series. He says- "I relied on keeping track of the scores that I got in each of the tests and check on the topics I wasn't able to score I used the tracker sheet to analyse my test scores. I think it helps you accelerate your progress, so a definite must-have."
- Figure out your schedule: It is important to understand what time you'll have no
 commitments and disturbances. If you are a student or a working professional,
 you need to find slots and windows in your schedule where you can give your
 undivided attention to your CAT Preparation. I personally recommend preparing a
 morning schedule as you'll find yourself at most ease during the morning.
- Prepare a detailed study plan: Once you have your schedule sorted, you can
 focus on your study plan. Note that Anirudh Das, one of the toppers of CAT 2023
 prepared for CAT within 3 months. He cracked one of the most difficult MBA
 exams in India with 99.81 percentile. Therefore, it doesn't matter if you are short
 on time, if one can do it, so can you!
- Practice Regularly with Mock Tests: As Kartik Bhageria says, the CAT 2023 topper with 99.99 percentile, mock test is the key. In his interview, he says- "I focused majorly on mock test and question paper to increase my attempt time with better accuracy". The key is to not get stuck for long on one topic.
- Maintain Consistency and Discipline: Practice makes a man perfect but that comes with Consistency and Discipline. Jayant Kochar's (CAT 2023- 99.62 percentile) success mantra is 'Consistency is the Key'. He says- 'Be consistent with the number of hours that you put into your preparation, that is what will keep you going'.



There are 8 verbal ability questions in CAT from para jumbles, para summary, para completion. The remaining 16 questions are from reading comprehension. Preparation Strategy: CAT VARC is of moderate to high difficulty, especially the RC passages. To score 99 percentile in CAT VARC, you need to focus on these 3 points each during your preparation and on the exam day-

During Preparation

- Focus on increasing your on-screen reading speed: Read more e-books, e-magazines, articles on various topics.
- Solve reading comprehension passages and para jumbles from previous year papers.
- Join a coaching institute's mock test series- CL, TIME, IMS, etc.

On Exam Day

- After reading the RC passage once, go through the questions to skim important areas for answering.
- You have 40 minutes to answer 24 questions, however, you should consider these 40 minutes to answer your target of about 15-16 questions for a 99+ percentile.
- Mark difficult questions for attempting later in case you have time left. More VARC Preparation Tips



Data Interpretation and Logical Reasoning (DILR)

In the last 2 years, an equal number of questions have been asked from CAT logical reasoning syllabus and CAT data interpretation syllabus. With no specific topics fixed for CAT DILR syllabus by IIM, it is essential to cover all the important topics based on the analysis of last 5 years papers and trends.

- Finally, just start with attempting questions from CAT previous year papers and afterwards take mock tests. Get More DILR Preparation Tips



How to Prepare for Quantitative Aptitude?

To improve your score in CAT quantitative aptitude, keep these things in mind during preparation:

- Make notes of the important formulae and shortcut techniques for last month's revision
- There are various free videos on youtube that can provide you with CAT quant shortcut methods and techniques and topic-wise tricks to save time.
- To improve your calculation speed, practice mental math or vedic math.
- Solve a question multiple times using multiple approaches to know the most efficient method for you.
- Take mock tests every week and analyze your performance. Most coaching centers also provide the best approach you should use for answering the questions in less time. More Quant Preparation Tips

Get 99 percentile in Quant

To get a 99 percentile in the CAT quant section, you need to make sure you get at least 13-14 questions right with not more than 1-2 questions incorrect. The points to keep in mind while attempting CAT quant paper on the exam day is:

- Do not spend more than 2-2.5 minutes on any question. Leave it if you cannot answer.
- Choose questions wisely- do not try to attempt every question.
- Avoid attempting questions you are not confident about. Negative marking should be avoided as much as possible.

Study Tips And Strategies by Subject Matter Experts

It requires a well-planned and meticulously designed preparation strategy of at least 3-4 months to achieve the 90+ percentile range. Note that the cut-offs for IIMs are usually in the range of 95-99+ percentile. Follow some of the tips to succeed:

- Solve questions asked in the previous year to be exam-ready.
- Taking CAT mocks is inevitable if you wish to crack the exam. Without attempting
 mocks, it is not possible to manage time and questions on exam day.
- Develop reading habits- either online articles, newspapers, magazines, textbooks, etc.
- Watch YouTube videos to get short tricks and methods to solve questions in less time.



Even an average student can get 90 percentile in CAT. It all depends on your preparation and exam day strategy. If you have covered topics of CAT syllabus as per weightage and follow these guidelines on the exam day, you can score above 90 percentile in CAT:

- Start with questions from topics that you find easy.
- Attempting the complete paper should not be your target. A good attempt in CAT to get you above 95%ile is:
 - o VARC- 13-15 questions
 - o DILR- 9-11 questions
 - Quant- 10-12 questions
- Avoid spending more than 2 minutes on one question.

Common Mistakes to Avoid During CAT Preparation

- 1. Not starting Early: A thumb rule for CAT preparation time is a minimum of 500 hours. If you put in even 3 hours of hard work and preparation, all you need is 5.5 months of preparation. So if you start early, you are not going to regret the extra time you have at your disposal.
- 2. Not Strategizing Your Preparation: You can achieve more with less effort if you work smartly. Assess your strengths and weaknesses and devise a plan targeting your weak spots. Once you have your plan you won't be in the dark.
- Not Taking/Analyzing Mock Test: For any competitive exam, the best way to test
 yourself is by giving mocks. It stimulates a similar environment as there in the
 CAT Exam. While taking the mock, make sure you analyse yourself adequately
 and work on your mistakes.
- 4. Not doing Revisions: Short-term memory in an average human being lasts for about an hour. You need revisions of topics you study to convert them into permanent storage in your brain as part of long-term memories. Therefore, it is important you revise the topics every now and then.
- 5. Skipping Topics: It is only okay to skip topics if you're supplementing it with loads of mock tests, if not you will regret the 4 marks you could have scored if you hadn't skipped that particular topic.

Expert Advice and Insights by Toppers

Based on subject matter experts and toppers' advice, we have devised the most important things to keep in mind while preparing for the CAT. They are as follows-

- 1. Time Bound Practice
- Avoid Referring to too many books
- Mock tests are the King
- 4. Don't stick to one topic for a long

Ques. What is the syllabus for CAT 2024?

Ans. The syllabus for CAT includes quantitative aptitude, logical reasoning, verbal ability, reading comprehension, and data interpretation. MBA CAT Syllabus for each of these sections further include various topics of study.

Ques. Is there any official syllabus for CAT?

Ans. IIMs (the CAT Conducting Body) does not release the official syllabus on their website. You can only find the sectional syllabus as per the norms of CAT including VARC, DILR and QA. You can find the detailed CAT Syllabus here in this page.

Ques. What's a good score in CAT?

Ans. A score above 100 is a good CAT score as per the latest pattern. With CAT score above 100, your chances of getting 99+ percentile are higher.

Ques. Which IIM is the hardest to get into?

Ans. With this idea, almost all IIMs are hard to get into, but the older ones acronymed as IIM BLACKIs are the hardest to get into. They include:

- IIM Bangalore
- IIM Lucknow
- IIM Ahmedabad
- IIM Calcutta
- IIM Kozhikode
- IIM Indore



Ques. Which IIM sets the toughest CAT paper?

Ans. Each year, CAT exam is conducted by one of the top 6 IIMs on a rotational basis. As per the analysis, CAT 2023, conducted by IIM Lucknow, was the toughest of all the CAT examinations. Also, the largest number of registrations that took place were during the CAT 2023 exam only.

Ques. How long should a candidate study in a day to get good grades in the entrance exam?

Ans. Regularity is important while preparing for CAT. Preparing a schedule that is convenient for you and helps you score better should be implemented Candidates should not over-pressurize themselves by studying for many hours, but regularly studying should be in practice.

Ques. I am scared of Maths. How do I prepare for Quant in CAT?

Ans. Start with the basic concepts and refer to Arun Sharma for initial preparation. Develop a habit of solving questions regularly and prepare alternate solving techniques for them. If well practiced through Mocks and previous year question papers candidates can score a good percentile in Quant.

Ques. Does having a full-time job affect preparing for CAT exam?

Ans. With the proper strategy in place having a full-time job will not affect your preparation but not to a great extent. CAT preparation can be done parallel to your work. But, you must build a schedule and stick to it to devote the required time for the preparation. Prior experience added to your CV can only benefit from getting admission.
