

OUR RESEARCH DEGREES

Our graduate schools offer research programs in most major disciplines.

DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY

Graduating with a Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) marks your admission to the community of scholars in your discipline and requires the completion of a thesis of 80,000–100,000 words on a specialised topic.

MASTER OF PHILOSOPHY

The Master of Philosophy (MPhil) is an internationally recognised masters degree by research and requires the completion of a thesis of 30,000–40,000 words.

MASTERS BY RESEARCH

Masters by Research degrees differ from the MPhil in that they may have a coursework component, along with a shorter thesis of about 30.000 words.

OUTSTANDING SUPPORT

Research training is a core activity of the University. Our comprehensive support will help you become a more effective researcher. We offer access to dedicated research centres, advanced research facilities, generous scholarships, unique professional development and established student support networks.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND FEES

DOMESTIC STUDENTS

Most domestic students are funded by the Australian Government Research Training Program (RTP) Fee Offset Scholarship, meaning you are exempt from paying tuition fees. See page 118.

Additional scholarships and awards are available to domestic graduate researchers, and can provide annual living allowances, relocation grants and paid parental and sick leave. See page 14.





You may be eligible if you're a domestic student and your personal circumstances have had an adverse effect on your academic achievement, or you're a member of a specified group that is underrepresented in higher education.

When you apply we'll consider the circumstances that have affected your academic achievement during your undergraduate study.

INCREASE YOUR CHANCES OF SECURING A CSP

When you apply, you enhance your chances of obtaining a Commonwealth Supported Place (CSP), which greatly reduces the cost of your graduate study.

BE CONSIDERED FOR A SCHOLARSHIP

All eligible applicants are automatically considered for a Graduate Access Melbourne Bursary or the Maisie Fawcett Scholarship to help with the costs of graduate study.


AM I ELIGIBLE?

Domestic students can apply using one or more of the following categories:

- Personal difficulties
- Disability or chronic medical condition
- Disadvantaged socioeconomic circumstances
- Rural or isolated background
- Recognition as an Indigenous Australian
- Previous status as a refugee or current holder of a humanitarian visa
- Women in engineering.

Our scholarships reward your talent and commitment. Below is a selection of scholarships you may be eligible for.

COURSEWORK SCHOLARSHIPS

The University offers various scholarships to students who have applied for a coursework degree, including:

- Future Generations Scholarship for high-achieving students
- Melbourne Graduate Access Scholarship and Maisie Fawcett Scholarship, for students who have applied under Graduate Access Melbourne (see page 13)
- Melbourne Indigenous Merit Scholarship for high-achieving students of Australian Indigenous descent who have applied under Graduate Access Melbourne.

High-achieving international students will be considered for:

- Melbourne Graduate Scholarship for high-achieving students
- Melbourne Humanitarian Access Scholarship for high-achieving students who have applied for asylum in Australia (application required)

AUSTRALIA AWARDS SCHOLARSHIPS

If you are an international student from a developing country and wish to undertake study or research in Australia, you may be eligible for the Australia Awards scholarship program, administered by the Australian Government.

RESEARCH SCHOLARSHIPS

The University offers more than 600 scholarships each year to attract talented research students nationally and internationally. Most scholarships provide a living allowance and/or a fee exemption. Scholarships include:

TRAVELLING SCHOLARSHIPS

Coursework students who intend to undertake overseas study (exchange or study abroad) can be considered for various Melbourne mobility awards, including the Melbourne Global Scholars Award.

The University also offers scholarships for students undertaking coursework and research at an overseas institution, such as the Rae and Edith Bennett Travelling Scholarship.




MAKING PUBLIC POLICY ACCESSIBLE TO YOUTH

My mental health placement on an acute psychiatric ward prepared me well with the fundamental skills I will need to work as a mental health nurse and provide the best care to patients.

"I think the best parts of the course are my peers and the class sizes. Compared to other universities, the University of Melbourne tends to have a smaller cohort which makes it easier to get to know everyone and form a tight bond with your peers. Another benefit of a small cohort is that the lecturer and subject coordinators can more closely interact with students."

COMPARING GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS TO IMPROVE FARM MANAGEMENT

To start your scientific career as a university researcher or teacher with a Doctor of Philosophy (PhD), you need strong knowledge of your field, determination, connections to researchers who can supervise you and a vision of what you want to achieve.

During her Master of Agricultural Sciences, Sineka Munidasa (Sri Lanka) managed to gain all of these. She is proud to have started her research journey through an industry-funded study that provides real benefit to the dairy industry in Australia.

The course mixes valuable subjects for anyone aiming to lead teams or organisations in the agriculture industry, with strong theoretical knowledge through specialisations in animal science, crop production, agricultural extension, sustainable production and agribusiness.

The Master of Agricultural Sciences also allows University of Melbourne students to build lasting industry and academic connections through research projects that directly address real-world challenges.

"The course structure was very flexible and the up-to-date scientific methods and understandings in the subjects match the current trends in the agriculture industry," Sineka says.

Her research compared potential greenhouse gas emissions between four different farm systems in northern Victoria, Australia.

"The increased detail Sineka generated by evaluating seasonal data is particularly of interest for the industry, as bulk yearly data doesn't provide sufficient detail of management changes," says her research supervisor, Dr Paul Cheng.

Not only has Sineka's research been published in industry literature she has also gained a position on further industry research projects evaluating climate change mitigation strategies in diverse dairy production systems to improve dairy business practices.

"As my primary research supervisor, Paul has helped me to identify my potential as a researcher and guided me through getting my work published. He and other supervisors have always guided me to help me succeed."

Most domestic graduate research students are offered a Research Training Program Fee Offset Scholarship, which is funded by the Australian Government.

If you are enrolled under the RTP you are exempt from tuition fees for the normal duration of your course. This exemption is valid for up to four years for students enrolled in a doctoral program and up to two years for a research masters degree.

AUSTRALIAN GOVERNMENT HELP LOANS

FEE-HELP: FOR STUDENTS IN AN AUSTRALIAN FEE PLACE

A loan scheme that helps eligible Australian fee-paying students (full-time or part-time) pay their graduate tuition fees.

FEE-HELP can cover all or part of your tuition fees. The Australian Government pays the amount of the loan direct to the University. You'll make repayments on your loan through the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) whenever your income is above the threshold, or you can make a voluntary repayment to the ATO at any time.

FEE-HELP is not means-tested and there is no loan fee for graduate study. If you already have a HECS-HELP loan from your undergraduate studies, you can still access a FEE-HELP loan.

IS INTEREST CHARGED ON MY LOAN?

No, you are not charged interest on your FEE-HELP loan. However, it is indexed each year with the Consumer Price Index (CPI), in line with the cost of living.

HECS-HELP: FOR STUDENTS IN A COMMONWEALTH SUPPORTED PLACE

HECS-HELP is a loan scheme that allows eligible domestic students in a Commonwealth Supported Place to defer their student contribution payments.

The Australian Government pays your student contribution amount. You only repay your HECS-HELP loan once your income meets the threshold. A HECS-HELP loan is not means-tested.

SA-HELP: FOR STUDENTS REQUIRED TO PAY SSAF

SA-HELP is a loan scheme that helps eligible students pay for all or part of their Student Services and Amenities Fee (SSAF). Eligible students can defer SSAF payments through SA-HELP

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

HOW TO SATISFY ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

You can generally satisfy the University's English language requirements, if your tertiary studies were taught and assessed entirely in English and were completed no more than two years ago.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE TEST

You can also meet the English language requirements by taking an approved proficiency test. Assessment must be taken in one sitting within 24 months preceding the proposed date of commencement of enrolment in one of the following proficiency tests:

- TOEFL
- IELTS (Academic)
- Pearson Test of English (Academic)
- Cambridge English: Advanced/Certificate in Advanced English.

Assessment must be taken in one sitting and within 24 months before your proposed commencement of enrolment.

Courses and graduate schools require different scores for admission. Look up the required scores for your course at:

DIAGNOSTIC ENGLISH LANGUAGE ASSESSMENT (DELA)

DELA identifies academic language skills that may need further development, so you can do as well as possible in your studies. You will have access to ongoing support to help you improve in specific areas.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE BRIDGING PROGRAM

Hawthorn-Melbourne, one of Australia's oldest and largest English language centres, is endorsed by the University of Melbourne as the sole external provider of the University of Melbourne English Language Bridging Program (UMELBP).

PACKAGED OFFERS FOR VISA PACKAGED OFFERS FOR VISA APPLICATIONS

Packaged offers enable you to obtain a single visa if you are undertaking an English language course at Hawthorn-Melbourne followed by a University of Melbourne course. You may be eligible for a packaged offer if:

- You have an offer that is only conditional on meeting the English language requirements of the University
- You have applied through an authorised University of Melbourne overseas representative
- You have a current IELTS test with results no more than 1 point lower than the required score for your course. TOEFL/ PTE/CAE equivalents also apply.

HOW DO I APPLY FOR A PACKAGE?

You must apply for a University course and a place in an English language course offered by Hawthorn-Melbourne. Your overseas representative will be able to assist you.

FEES

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

Tuition fees are charged for each year you are enrolled. Tuition fees depend on the degree you are studying and your study load each semester.

YOUR COURSE FEES

An estimate of the fees payable is shown in the courses by study area section on pages 22-111.

The listed fees are a guide to the total amount you may need to pay. Fees are subject to annual review and may be adjusted each year.

Note: If the duration of the course is one year or less, we have provided an estimate of the total program fee (assuming completion in 2023). For courses that cannot be completed in one year, the total program fee may include an indexation of the 2023 course fee. For courses of more than one year, the fee is an estimate for one year of study (100 credit points) in 2023. Tuition fees for the second and subsequent years may increase.

OVERSEAS STUDENT HEALTH COVER

To comply with the student visa requirements set by the Australian Government Department of Home Affairs, you are required to purchase visa-length Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) at the time you accept your course offer, and maintain your OSHC while studying in Australia.

The University can arrange visa-length OSHC on your behalf with Bupa, the University's preferred OSHC provider. See:

GLOSSARY

A

Advanced standing: Status/credit/exemptions granted on the basis of work already completed at another post-secondary institution.

Australian student: See 'Domestic student'.

В

Bachelors degree: Usually your first degree at university, a bachelors degree is the highest undergraduate award offered.

C

Cambridge CAE: The Cambridge English: Advanced/ Certificate in Advanced English (CAE) is an English test recognised by the University as meeting our English language requirements. See page 126.

Commonwealth Supported Place (CSP): A course place for domestic students where the Australian Government contributes to the cost of your study. HECS-HELP loans are available to assist eligible students in paying the student contribution amount. See page 118 or go to: studyassist.gov.au

Course: At the University of Melbourne, 'course' refers to a program of study or a degree (not individual subjects).

Coursework degree: Coursework degrees are structured programs of study that have set classes and assignments. Some may include a research component.

Credit points: The workload of most graduate coursework courses is represented using a points system. The normal maximum workload allowed for each year of a course is 100 credit points. The point value the overall time a student is expected to allocate to that subject.

CRICOS: Commonwealth Register of Institutions and Courses for Overseas Students.

D

Discipline: An area of learning.

Domestic student: An Australian or New Zealand citizen, Australian permanent resident or holder of a permanent humanitarian visa, regardless of whether citizenship or residency rights are held for a country other than Australia.

Ε

${\bf EFTSL} \ ({\bf Equivalent} \ {\bf Full-Time} \ {\bf Student} \ {\bf Load});$

A measure of study load. One EFTSL is equivalent to 100 credit points and represents a standard annual full-time study load.

English language requirements: Specific English requirements that all students must meet before they can receive an offer to study at the University. See page 126.

F

Fee place: An enrolment at the University where a student is responsible for the full cost of the enrolment

FEE-HELP: An Australian Government loan scheme for eligible students who enrol in an Australian fee place to pay tuition fees for graduate study. See page 119 or go to: **studyassist.gov.au**

G

GMAT (Graduate Management Admission Test): This test measures verbal, mathematical and analytical writing skills. See: **mba.com**

Graduate Access Melbourne: The University's access and equity program for graduate study. See page 13 or go to: **gradaccess.unimelb.edu.au**

Graduate certificate: First level of study after an undergraduate degree. May be the first half of a graduate diploma or an academic award in its own right. Six months in duration.

Graduate degree/course: A further degree or course of study available to students after the completion of an undergraduate degree. Designed for those who wish to obtain specialist knowledge in an academic or professional discipline.

Graduate diploma: First level of study after an undergraduate degree or graduate certificate. One year in duration.

Graduate research degree: The development and completion of an in-depth, independent research project. Examples include the Doctor of Philosophy, Master of Philosophy and Masters by Research.

Graduate Record Examination (GRE): This test measures verbal reasoning, quantitative reasoning, critical thinking and analytical writing skills.

Н

Honours: A one-year extension (with a research component) of a three-year undergraduate degree.

IELTS (International English Language Testing System): This test is recognised by the University as meeting our English language requirements if the required scores are attained. See page 126.

Intensive mode: A type of course delivery over a shorter period than a typical semester-based delivery. May have a residential component.

International student: Any student who is not an Australian or New Zealand citizen, Australian permanent resident or holder of a permanent humanitarian visa.

L

LSAT: Law School Admission Test. This test measures acquired reading and verbal reasoning skills. See: **lsac.org**

M

Masters by Coursework: Provides advanced specialist or professional training in a particular discipline or interdisciplinary area.

0

OSHC (Overseas Student Health Cover):

Compulsory health insurance that international students must hold to meet student visa requirements. See page 126.

P

Pearson Test of English (Academic): An academic English language test recognised by the University as meeting our English language requirements if the required scores are attained. See page 126.

Permanent residency (PR): Australian permanent residents are considered domestic students for the purposes of admission to the University of Melbourne. International students who obtain Australian PR status, either before commencing or while enrolled, must notify the University immediately.

Prerequisite: A requirement that must be met before commencing study.

Professional Doctorate: Consists of a combination of coursework and research. May require a substantial period of professional practice for entry. Normally three years in duration.

R

Research Training Program (RTP):

A Commonwealth funding program that provides fee offsets (fee exemptions) and scholarships for domestic graduate research students. Limited RTP scholarships are also available to international students. See page 118.

S

Semester: One of two divisions of an academic year. At the University of Melbourne, semesters usually begin in February and July and are 12 weeks long.

Ť

Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL): An international English language test recognised by the University as meeting our English language requirements if the required scores are attained. See page 126.

U

Undergraduate degree/course: Your first degree at university. At the University of Melbourne, courses defined as undergraduate include bachelors degrees, bachelors degrees with honours, concurrent diplomas and associate degrees.

W

Weighted Average Mark (WAM): The Weighted Average Mark provides an indication of overall academic performance in each course that a student studies. Expressed as a percentage, it is used to assess applications for further study, employment and scholarships.
